





NATURE STRIKES LOW BLOW—The West suffered the worst of any region, Washington was the hardest hit of any state in the region and Whatcom county possibly took it harder than any other in the state Friday—the thirteenth. These Herald photographs portray results of the week end blizzard.

Top, the bleak scene of wintry wrath, showing downed utility poles, was a graphic picture of distress in the northern part of the county. This shot was taken looking westward two miles from Sumas, which was isolated until Saturday.

Center, Bellingham street scene was taken at 1:45 p. m. Friday but the darkness of the sky, distress of pedestrian and absence of people and cars vividly portray the effect of the storm.
